FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Do I need QTS?

No. Whilst all of our teachers must be working towards the fulfilment of the Teacher Standards, we will train you ourselves to meet the school's 'excellence criteria' for teaching and learning. Teachers who fulfil the Department for Education's AO (Assessment Only) requirements will be supported to apply for QTS (usually) at the beginning of their third year of teaching.

When would I start?

Usually this would be the beginning of the academic year, or at the end of the previous June.

What will I be paid?

In your first year at the school you will be paid on the unqualified scale (UQ 3 currently £29,141). Throughout the year your progress will be reviewed against the Teacher Standards. The expectation is that you would demonstrate that you fulfil these standards and start your second year on point 1 of the main scale (currently £34,513, reaching £51,179 on UPS 5). You will also be eligible to join the Teachers' Pension Scheme.

How will I be trained?

You will be allocated both a teaching and learning mentor and a subject specialist who will, alongside the school's CPD Coordinator, develop a programme for you. They will be some of our best teachers and committed to making you the very best teacher you can be.

What proportion of my time will be spent in the classroom?

You will begin with a reduced (less than 50%) timetable, developing over the course of the year up to 70%. In the second year the timetable will be 90%.
